Givens moved Burch second to approve Ordinance 2021-08 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 12-155 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF LEOTI ADDING A STOP SIGN AT THE CORNER OF 6TH STREET AND I STREET WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF LEOTI. Modified to place a sign at the intersection of Sixth Street and I Street stopping northbound traffic on Sixth Street. Motion carried unanimously.

Council reviewed City Attorney Faurot's information on residency in RV/Campers and trailers parked on streets. Council agreed there were changes that need to be made to the rules and regulations. The items were tabled until council has more time to look over the information presented by Faurot.
